
In Room One has continued to blow me away with their learning! Here is what we have been up to lately...


Writing: We have been focusing on using describing words in our writing to make our writing more interesting. We have made lists of more interesting words to use for sizes and words we can add to describe colours. We have put these new words to good use by creating wanted posters for the Big Bad Wolf. 
Reading: Many reading groups have been focusing on finding and locating information to justify their ideas. The students have been getting quick at skimming and scanning to quickly find the information they need. This is something easy to practice at home too. Try these questions, how do you know that? Find me a sentence to prove this.

Maths: We have been practicing using different addition strategies with two and three digit numbers. The students are having lots of success with this. Next week we will be moving on to subtraction.

Art: We have been working on our sketching skills and have been learning how to draw different facial features. We are just beginning to now put these together. This is something we will continue to work on in our afternoons before swimming and we will aim to share these at one of the assemblies at the end of











Room 2

This week Room 2 have been working on our Pepeha's. A Pepeha is way of introducing yourself in Te Reo.

It tells people who you are by sharing your connections with the people and places that are important to you. It's been really interesting seeing where the tamariki are from and what is significant to them. We have also been enjoying listening to the song Pepeha by Six60.

Nina taught us about her French culture. It was amazing for her to share the language, food and style with Room 2. We have had lots of fun using French in class and learning more about different cultures within our class.

It's been a busy 2 weeks in Room 3 and has been great that we have been able to get into the pool nearly every day and nearly every child is remembering the swimming gear. We are currently working on freestyle and backstroke. Lots of the children have beautiful freestyle strokes, which would indicate that lots of you have sourced private swimming lessons for your children. This is awesome.

Backstroke has been very entertaining as so many of the children appear to be sinkers rather than floaters! Hopefully this is something we can work on in the next couple of weeks. Remember to pack togs every day, even if the weather looks a bit uncertain in the morning. With the increase in drownings in our waters this year, the fundamentals of water safety are so important.

We have been working on our laptops in the afternoons, to familiarise ourselves with google docs and google classroom. I have set a couple of challenges for the children which have been very entertaining as we navigate these programs. I am impressed with the children's confidence with their laptops. I am currently looking into websites that support learning for reading/writing and maths. I am waiting for matheletics to come back to me. If any of you have any websites that you personally find good for learning, I would love to hear from you.

FYI – your child should be bringing home their spelling homework every Monday and it is to be returned to school on Friday. Students have a choice on bringing reading books home. Let me know if you require them to bring a book home daily. Library is Wednesday.




Room 5


Thank you to Beau and his mum for sending in the strawberry popcorn. This was a new experience for us.
