Room One have had another fantastic week!



Room 2 has been learning about adjectives.

An adjective is a describing word. Room 2 had a challenge this week. They needed to describe a food enough so someone could guess the food without looking at the picture.

We have created a book to share in class with everyone's finished copy. I'm very impressed with how they all turned out!

We are expanding our vocabulary to make our discussions and writing more interesting.





Room 3

I hope you managed to catch the amazing Room 3 girls at assembly on Friday. They had been working hard on the song about friendship and kindness. The boys opted out of singing and chose to do knock knock jokes instead. This was a challenge for some of them as they have quiet voices.

Our swimming finished on Monday with a great session in the pool – fully clothed. Thanks to the parents who sent along clothes with their children. It was an interesting experience for them to try and swim and then get out of their clothes in the deep end of the pool. Hopefully they all understood the message of not swimming with clothes or how to get out of a tricky situation if they fall into water.

Now that swimming has finished, we are really getting into our maths. The children are currently looking at equivalent fractions and how they work. It is providing lots of discussion and it's great to see the children working together.

This has been a very distrupted week and there will be no spelling testing on Friday. The children will have their current set of words for 2 weeks.

FYI – your child should be bringing home their spelling homework every Monday and it is to be returned to school on Friday. Students have a choice on bringing reading books home. Let me know if you require them to bring a book home daily. Library is Wednesday.







In Room 4 we have been learning about persuasive writing. We have been working on writing an opinion piece on a topic we are passionate about. It's been interesting to see the different opinions that the students have. Some prefer cats to dogs while others find dogs to be the superior pet. We're aiming to display the finished writing pieces on the wall somewhere so please keep an eye out for them next time you visit our classroom.







In Room 5 we have been doing a ton of reading. From Ancient Roman Baths to Maya the Yale University student who became a world-famous architect. Students have been answering comprehension questions based on the text. More importantly students are using examples from the text to justify and support their answers. Vocabulary is explored each Monday as students identify unknown words and implement these into their writing. During Writing students are developing the main components of a narrative. Characters' personalities have been explored and how these different personalities can enhance the story's pace and dynamics. Numbers to 1,000,0000 has been our focus this week, but we decided to push it up to 100,000,0000 because Room 5 students mean business. Our new student Ezra introduced us all to a new game that the students are growing to love because of its strategic approach. We have also managed to squeeze in some art this week to help brighten up our classroom. Students have been exploring complementary colours, line work and detailing techniques. The look fantastic! Our mathematical unit is addition and subtraction. At present the students are using materials and pictures to join sets together and count all or to separate sets and count the remaining items. Their next step is to use imaging to solve addition and subtraction problems by counting all the objects in their heads.
