They have created some beautiful illustrations of key parts in the stories. Their writing has also blown me away with lots of interesting describing words, action words, sequence words and even some similes too! These will be on display in our classroom so come and have a read when you can.

In maths, we have been learning all about statistics. We have learnt about the statistical cycle and created our own posters to display our individual investigations. Students are confident in using tally charts, creating pictograms and making statements about their findings. We will be moving back into addition and subtraction strategies for the end of the term.

Excellence has been a huge focus within our classroom this term as it is one of our important school values. Students are always encouraged to try their best and produce high quality work. It has been great to see students strive to achieve this without being prompted. Feel free to use this word at home lots with your child too! In Room 2 we are exploring a thesaurus. A thesaurus gives us new and interesting words to include in our writing. We have put these words on our wall and we are creating a word wall to refer back to when we are writing.

We have also been doing measuring during maths. We have been using our body parts to measure objects around the room. We have learnt that there a few important rules when we are measuring to ensure we have an accurate measure.

Room 2 have learnt about the 5 oceans. We have learnt where they are and the names of them. We also learnt the pacific ocean is the biggest ocean.





What a crazy week last week was. Congratulations to the students who represented Rukuhia at the Lower Waipa Sports. Those who stayed behind had an awesome day learning about the Maori legend, The battle of the mountains, as well as completing art work based on this. They were also fantastic 'big kids' when we took the junior classes out for some games. It is great for the Year 4's to have leadership roles around the school.

This week has seen me testing the students in preparation for our mid year reports. I am pleased to say that the testing has been very positive.

Our instructional writing proved hilarious. I'm pleased to report that we all made it to our destinations, with some creative interpretation of the instructions. This week we have been looking at a writing component called 'show me, don't tell me'. This involves the use of descriptive language in our writing.

With input from students I model writing sentences each day. On a Friday we write about our weekly poem in our poem books. Students are learning to hear the sounds in words and to write the letter that matches the sound. We have been learning how to make our writing more interesting by adding adjectives (describing words), direct speech and alliteration (words beginning with the same letter). Your children have written some great stories. The letters this week are: b h n o d and the letters for Week 9 are: g l v y r. The word family this week is train/main and for Week 9 it is: all/tall.

Room 6 students love reading! Thank you again for making this such a positive experience at home. We continue to read each day at school - guided reading, shared reading, and independent reading. Plus I read picture books to students and we also read high frequency words in isolation, poems and finger plays.

Within maths we are now looking at patterns. The students have been creating colour patterns, object patterns, number patterns and picture patterns. Feel free to support this at home by discussing patterns in the environment - patterns in curtains, bricks, pavers, cushions, clothes, fences, etc.

Our topic for maths will move into time next week. We will be focusing on both digital and analogue time.
