# **Covid Update**

To Parents and caregivers,

You will all be aware, there are several local schools that have Covid cases in their school and/ or community.

The following is an overview of if we receive a notification at Rukuhia School.

Firstly, let me thank all those parents and caregivers that are wearing masks and social distancing on school grounds. This does help and while it may not prevent an outbreak, it will defiantly limit the spread if we continue to follow and respect the health guidelines.

If we do get a reported Covid case, the directive from the MOE is that we contact the Covid SPOC Hotline (SPOC – Single Point of Contact) and the MOE Covid Response Team. Once a notification is made and the relevant information is gathered they will then direct us as to the requirements regarding isolation, testing, attendance etc.

This information will be passed on via email to all parties and will be updated as new information is received.

The staff are preparing to teach from home. Classroom teachers will run through the programmes with their class and inform parents / caregivers via email.

Please note that if a staff member is sick the distance learning may differ due to the severity of the teacher's condition.

As a staff we ask for your support and patience – everyday updated requirements and procedures are thrust upon us. There is a lot of conflicting information out in the public, depending on what site you visit. We work under the direction from the MOE and MOH, these are the procedures and policies that we work to and pass on to our community.

The Rukuhia School uniform is often the most visual statement of our school's identity in the wider community and reflects on who we are and what our school stands for. How our students wear the uniform conveys a strong message about our school. Parents / caregivers, students and staff have a shared responsibility in maintaining uniform standards – i.e. keeping the uniform clean, presentable and ensuring it is worn with pride.

## Purpose

The correct wearing of the Rukuhia School uniform helps set the tone and atmosphere of the school, and;

- 1. Gives students a sense of identity and pride in themselves and the school.
- 2. Maintains a standard reflective of Rukuhia School.
- 3. Promotes equality amongst all students.

**Below Are the School Guidelines** 

- Wearing the regulation uniform is a condition of attendance at Rukuhia School and has been since January 2015. This was the completion of the 7 year introduction process.
- 2. The Board of Trustees in consultation with the school community will set the regulation uniform. Any changes to the regulation uniform will be advertised and will become effective immediately or phased in over a twelve month period.
- 3. It is expected that the uniform will be worn with pride in an appropriate and presentable manner as determined by the school management.
- 4. Students not wearing correct uniform require a note from home. Where there are financial or other difficulties, parents / caregivers should approach the principal who may grant individual dispensation in cases of genuine need.
- 5. Parents / caregivers of children who regularly wear incorrect uniform will be advised in writing and given an opportunity to rectify this.
- 6. It is recommended that all items of uniform be clearly named.
- 7. Students must wear correct uniform to and from school. Correct uniform shall also be worn on all school outings except when excursions require alternative clothing,
  - i.e. shoreline studies, bush walks etc.
- 8. Rukuhia School requires students to:
  - Wear a regulation sunhat during Terms One and Four.
  - Wear only one plain stud or sleeper per earlobe, if ears are pierced. Suitable earrings will be determined at the discretion of the Senior Leadership Team.
  - Wear any religious or cultural items under their shirts.
  - All other jewellery will be at the discretion of the Senior Leadership Team.
  - Hair must be a natural colour other than organised events I.e. Crazy Hair Day
- 9. Suitable, older clothing needs to be worn on the field during winter months for

# **Before and After School Supervision**

Rukuhia School is committed to ensuring students' safety before and after school. The school will provide out of school supervision of students from 8.30am – 9.00am and from 3pm-3.15pm. Outside these hours, students' safety is the responsibility of parents and caregivers.

# Guidelines

The school is unable to provide supervision for students who arrive at school before 8.30am.

Children dropped off before 8.30am, who do not attend before school care will remain the responsibility of the parents until 8.30am when the school will provide supervision.

We encourage students to be at school by 8.30am – 8.45am, to prepare for the day.

If students need to be dropped off before 8.30am, we strongly recommend that parents/caregivers make use of the private before and after school care facility located next door to the school. A charge applies. This is set by the before and after school care providers.

After school, students are to be picked up at 3.00pm. The school is unable to provide supervision after 3.15pm.

If students cannot be collected by 3.15pm, we strongly recommend that parents/caregivers make use of the private before and after school care facility located next door to the school. A charge applies. This is set by the before and after school care providers

If issues arise regarding the drop off and pick up of students, parents / caregivers will be contacted by the school.

If you are not collecting your child/ren and have made arrangements for a family member or friend to do the pickup please let the school / teacher know. We do not release students into the care of people who are not authorised to collect your children. Morning Drop Off:

Classrooms will be open at 8.30am and we encourage students to be at school between 8.30-8.45am to prepare for the day.

Classes start at 9.00am. It is very disruptive to the morning procedure if children turn up late. To avoid unnecessary disruption to our students learning, please have your children at school before 9.00am.

Afternoon Pick Up:

So as to keep our students safe and ensure that all students get home safely, the following procedures are in place:

### Years 1 - 3

- 1. All parents will need to collect their child/ren at their class.
- 2. Students need to be collected from class at 3.00pm and no later than 3.15pm as we are unable to provide supervision after this time.
- 3. If they are attending After School Care, students will be sent to the meeting place / Red Room at the hall.

## Years 4 - 8

- 1. If walking or biking Go straight home (Fluro Bag Covers must be on )
- 2. If you are being picked up by a parent or caregiver go directly to the arranged pick up area.
- 3. If they are attending After School Care, students will be sent to the meeting place / Red Room at the hall.

4. If they are meeting a sibling in a junior class, students go straight to their brother or sister's class and wait quietly until the class teacher invites them in and they are then to be collected by parents / caregivers.

Please Note: These Guidelines may change if Covid-19 levels change, you will be notified of any changes.
