

## Rukuhia Christmas Festival

18th November 2022

3.00 pm to 7.00 pm

Kia ora Parents/Whanau



Students will be investigating how to raise money through having a stall at the festival. The learning will focus on Social Sciences - understand that people have different roles and responsibilities as part of their participation in groups. Key competencies will be - thinking, using language, symbols, and text, managing self, relating to others and participating and contributing.

Each classroom will be responsible for a stall, maybe two:

Room / Icky Sticky Sweetshop - consisting of homemade marmalade, jam, lemon honey and sweet treats (truffles, bliss balls, etc). Room I students will be making some things, however we welcome donations of 'sweet' and 'savoury' (pickles, chutneys) items. Please see Rachael or Jane.

Room Z Creative Candles - candles in fancy jars made by Room Z.

Room 3 Glorious Gardens - plants, seedlings, cuttings, flowers. If you are interested in potting up some cuttings and/or plants from your garden please see Leanne. If you would like to donate some fresh flowers on the day, then again see Mrs Adam.

Room 4 The Toy Box/The Book store - old toys and books that are clean and in good condition. Room 4 students will be asking for donations from the whole school.

Room 5 The Cafe-Room 5 students will be serving food that is donated by PTA members and families.

Plus

PTA/Parents/Whanau HO HO HO Crafty Christmas Shop - donated handmade items made by staff and PTA members. If you enjoy creating and would like to donate something please see Jane or Becky Ahmadi.

PTA/Parents/Whanau Bake Table - donated baking by PTA and parents/whanau.



There will be food available to purchase for dinner such as nachos - meat and vegetarian options, hot dogs, and the Lions Food Truck (chips, battered sausages). Many thanks to the Lions for supporting our venture.

We will be asking for donations to make this venture a fundraising success. There will be a board outside Room I for parents/whanau to sign to offer their time and food items. The more families that help the less time the PTA will have to 'man' the stalls. PTA members would like to spend some time during the evening with their mokopuna/children and whanau/families too! If you sign your name for a specific time then your child will be helping you on the stall.

The 2023 Year 4 to Year 8 stationery requirements will include a device (computer or Chromebook) please see the following options for the purchase or rental of a Chromebook from the school:

## 2023 Digital Device Options:

- 1. Parents supply their own BYOD that meets their needs and the schools requirements.
- 2. Parents Lease only \$20 per term At any time parents can enter into a lease to buy and the payments to date will be deducted from the balance owing to own outright. (Payment terms can be negotiated on the balance)
- 3. Parents lease to buy at \$28.58 per term over 3 years / 12 terms (End of 12 terms Parents own outright) If the family leave the balance must be paid in full on full payment the Parents own will the device outright. Payments to date are not refundable if returning the device. Assistive Technology Agreement will be entered into (see attached) At any time parents can settle the balance to purchase outright.
- 4. 4. Parents lease to buy at \$88.75 per term (End of 4 terms Parents own outright) If the family leave the balance must be paid in full on full payment the Parents own will the device outright. Payments to date are not refundable if returning the device. Assistive Technology Agreement will be entered into (see attached) At any time parents can settle the balance to purchase outright.
- 5. 5. Parents purchase outright for \$355 (Parents own outright)

The students have returned to school with **such enthusiasm for learning**. They have already created some super stories about their holidays. We welcome back our student teachers, Kyra and Grace. They will be in Room 1 for four whole weeks. We are super excited about them teaching alongside us. They are in their second year of training and their enthusiasm is outstanding.


This term we are continuing to focus on:

- Daily reading thank you to those parents/whanau that are listening to their child read each day and encouraging their child to bring their book bag. *Our school expectation for children turning 6 years of age is Level 15/16 and this is usually achievable when children practice everyday at home.*
- Daily writing continue to discuss your home experiences and interesting words with your child. Children share their stories and it motivates them to write. We have finally caught up with spelling books if your child does not have new spelling words this weekend then that is because they were away on Friday or did not have their spelling book at school on Friday.
- Daily mathematics with emphasis on number knowledge, number strategies and fractions. Students are currently using a number line to complete addition and subtraction problems, then the students will learn to identify halves, quarters, whole numbers and complete equal sharing tasks. You are welcome to follow up on this at home with baking and sharing activities.
- Health & PE athletics at present. This includes running, throwing and jumping. We have been invited to Paterangi School for a junior athletics day. This is a fun opportunity book in Tuesday, 15th November. Parents/whanau are invited along. We hope to travel by bus more information to come.
- ⇒ Social Sciences our inquiry topic is based around the PTA Christmas Festival. Students will be baking and making things to sell on our Icky Sticky Sweetshop.

Please name all student's clothing, especially hats and shoes. Sadly we continue to have lots of socks left at school and we do ask students each day about items. Any concerns about your child please email us.

In Room 2 we have been learning about volume and capacity. We have been enjoying comparing different containers and their capacity. Next we discussed how full the containers were using half and quarters. The students have been enjoying doing some experimenting using different shapes and sized containers.

Welcome back to Term 4.

The children in class have been enjoying showing him how our class works. Next week we have Miss Sutton starting for her 4 week practicum, including going to camp with the year 4 students in week 3.

The year 3 students are looking at fractions for maths, in particular ½ and ¼, so there is lots of talk about equal sharing of objects. Ask them questions at home to see how their learning is going. The year 4's are looking at money. We are having a great time 'buying' lots of things, adding money and will be learning about giving change.

In writing this term we are going to have a go at writing and illustrating picture books for younger children.

We begin our P.E. unit of Run, jump, throw – Athletics. Any 8 year olds and over will be able to attempt to qualify for the Lower Waipa athletics day later in November. The year 3 students will be working towards our athletics day at Paterangi, date to be confirmed. This is an action packed term!

With a million questions being asked we thought we would explore the skill of questioning within our Reading. What has the text told us? What have the images told us? 
Room 5 are busy preparing for our visit to Wellington in Week 4. We are studying parliament and the history of the beehive and how Ministers are elected to government.
