Part Two: Tickets Sales

Ticket sales will be cash only \$10 per ticket, through the PTA via the school office.

This year, to ensure all immediate families get a chance to purchase production tickets we will be opening up 'Family Sales' on Week 6 - Monday 21st - Friday 25th August.

During this week all families will have the opportunity to purchase tickets for their immediate family – Mum, Dad and siblings- each family member must have a ticket if they are attending.

Through Weeks 7 and 8 all remaining tickets will be available for general purchase.

e.g. If you have 4 RED family tickets you can now purchase another 2 RED tickets for the grandparents, if seats are available.

This is a cash only \$10.00 per ticket, first in first serve basis and we cannot book or hold tickets.

As we gear up to present an outstanding performance, we would like to kindly request your cooperation on a small matter. While we cherish having all of our students' families in attendance, we would like to create the best possible experience for everyone involved.



This week the students have been focusing on fractions. We have discussed equal sharing and even pieces. Students are learning to identify a half and a quarter. Feel free to follow up on this at home.

We are right back into daily reading and writing. The students are so excited about their writing and want

to share their stories with their classmates. Our letters next week are: p t c i u. The letters for Week 3 are: e n o d g. The word family next week is: got/not. Week 3 word family is: big/wig.

Each afternoon the students practice forming the letter of the day, writing words beginning with the letter of the day, writing a quick sentence as well as practicing their spelling words. Your child may bring home their inquiry and language book full of spelling - I will send you an email or chat about purchasing a new book.

We have had great chats about Matariki this week. The students have produced some wonderful stars and a awesome visual display of kites.
