READING

On Monday, the students followed their regular reading programme left by Mrs O'Brien. The rest of the week we read activity sheets on the seasons and weather.

The class read two "nonsense" poems - "On the Ning Nang Nong" by Spike Milligan and "The People Upstairs" By Ogden Nash. The class completed Art activities related to the poems.

MATHEMATICS

Each day the class has completed basic facts tasks focusing on addition and subtraction. We also studied the thermometer and now understand where we use them. We also have completed task on how to read them.

REPORT WRITING, SCIENCE AND ART






Room 2 have been learning about everything fire safety. What is a fire? What do we use fire for? The difference between tools and toys. We were lucky enough to have a local fire fighter Steve, come into class and teach us the fire wise programme. We learnt about lighting fires safely, checking our fire alarms, having a safe meeting spot at home and get down, get low and get out!




We have also been training for cross country. We have been finding our jogging pace and working on our breathing. So we last the whole race. We have also spoken about using our whole body as we run to help us go faster. Using our arms and having longer strides. The children are improving so quickly! I am so proud of the positive attitude of all of Room 2. This is the school value we are focusing on this term. So it's awesome to see everyone giving it a go.









Room 3 are currently writing letters. We have had some interesting discussions about why we don't write letters anymore. The children are going to be writing one letter to someone that they know and then a letter to someone from another planet. This should produce some awesome creative writing. If you want to encourage your child to write at home, look at writing letters/emails to other members of the family who don't live with you or friends from holiday spots. It's a great way to communicate and get something in the letterbox!

Our cross country training has started and the children seem to be enjoying our fitness games. We will start some long distance running at school. If your child prefers to run in sneakers, please send them to school in a mud proof bag that they can keep in their cubbyhole. We are hoping to run every day – weather permitting.

In maths we are working on addition and subtraction, exploring different strategies to decide which is the most efficient way to solve problems. Ask your child which strategies they are currently working on or show them how you would solve addition problems using 2 digit numbers such as 54 + 32 or 50+ 40+20+60+80.

Our recent big news is that we had some windows ripped out and covered up. We now have more wall space where the windows were but more importantly this will enable the rain/sun cover to be extended the whole length of the classroom so we can open our blinds without being blinded! We spent the two days of construction up at the hall and the attached red room doing some fun worksheets and writing challenges and playing different versions of dodgeball.

For writing we have been working on writing information reports for different animals. Hopefully we can use our increased wall space to display these when they're completed.

Over the last 2 weeks the students of Room 5 have been creating their very own Gods / Guardians. Each student has chosen a realm for their Gods to protect. Using similes and metaphors, students have written an in-depth character description about their Gods, discussing such things as their physical appearance, how they sound and move, how they make others feel, unique attributes and what their homes / realms look like. Using an incredible digital programme called Hero Forge, the students have also created 3D models of their characters. The imagination and creativity of these students is absolutely incredible. We have Hysstoria, the God of History. Numeros, the God of Numbers and Viretas, the God of Reality.

Last week was interesting when Mr Drury paid Room 5 a visit to challenge our knowledge in Algebra. Poor Mr Drury tried to scare us with a Year 9 math book but sadly the majority of Room 5 students are working above the Year 9 level in Algebra. Next week Mr Drury will challenge 4 Room 5 students in an addition, subtraction, division and multiplication competition. If Room 5 wins we all get a muffin each. If Mr Drury wins, Room 5 has to clean the entire school. While the students train for this Mr Drury butt kicking, they have also been learning about Spreadsheets and how algebraic formulas can help assist these. This week Arjun and Luca got out their hammers and saws and made a good start on the junior mud kitchen that they are working on while

the senior students are attending Technology. They cannot wait to see the junior students faces when

they hand over their woodworking masterpiece.

The Firewise Programme created lots of interesting discussion and the students wrote some great stories about keeping safe near fires. Feel free to look at the display in Room 6. This programme was supported by a visit from a firefighter - this generated some superb stories too.

Within maths we continue to look at fractions - sharing groups of objects evenly between our buddies. We will move into addition with an emphasis on knowing our doubles up to 20 - some students will challenge themselves even further as they already have this knowledge. Also we will do some multiplication - mainly 2's, 5's and 10's.

Thank you for supporting your child's reading each night and helping your child to learn their spelling words. Their knowledge of their spelling words is transferred into their daily writing - awesome learning!

Ahu Ake – Waipā Community Spatial Plan

We're running our first ever World Café and looking for residents from across the district to join us!

The World Café will bring community members, Council staff and experts together to discuss different topics that we need further feedback on at tables around a room. It will be run as part of the development of Ahu Ake – Waipā Community Spatial Plan and is an exciting opportunity for us to share knowledge, collaborate and generate ideas on the more complex issues in the spatial plan with our community.

So, what's it all about?

Earlier this year, we received thousands of valuable pieces of feedback on what the future of our district could look like. This not only helped to confirm some of the challenges we are up against now and in the future, but highlighted areas in the plan that we need to flesh out further before progressing with its development. We'll use the World Café to discuss topics including growth, housing, the economy and parks and public facilities with residents and working through possible solutions to questions like: 'How can our villages continue to grow while keeping their rural character?'. The ideas and insights developed during this process will be presented to the Mayor and councillors to consider as we work towards finalising this important plan next year.

What's required?

Participants will be required to attend 3-4 workshops (all part of the World Café process) which will be run in September, October and November 2023. Those who take part will receive a \$150 Prezzy Card as a thank you for their time. Residents can sign-up online at www.ahuakewaipa.nz/our-spatial-plan or by picking up a hardcopy survey at either of our Council offices or libraries.

Sign-ups close on Wednesday 23August 2023. After this point, we'll make the registrations of interest anonymous and then select 40-45 community members to take part in the World Café. More information about this process is available on our website.

It is important we hear from a wide range of people with different backgrounds and experiences of living in Waipā. So, if you're a resident and over the age of 16, we want to hear from you!
