Part Two : Tickets Sales

Ticket sales will be cash only \$10 per ticket, through the PTA via the school office.

This year, to ensure all immediate families get a chance to purchase production tickets we will be opening up 'Family Sales' on Week 6 - Monday 21st - Friday 25th August.

During this week all families will have the opportunity to purchase tickets for their immediate family – Mum, Dad and siblings- each family member must have a ticket if they are attending.

Through Weeks 7 and 8 all remaining tickets will be available for general purchase.

e.g. If you have 4 RED family tickets you can now purchase another 2 RED tickets for the grandparents, if seats are available.

This is a cash only \$10.00 per ticket, first in first serve basis and we cannot book or hold tickets.

As we gear up to present an outstanding performance, we would like to kindly request your cooperation on a small matter. While we cherish having all of our students' families in attendance, we would like to create the best possible experience for everyone involved.

First off, I just wanted to say a huge thank you to those parents who made it in to school for parent teacher interviews. It was great to catch up with you all and share the success your child is having in Room 1.

We have been stuck into report writing lately and the students' are really enjoying this. We are becoming experts at classifying animals and have been busy ready lots of non- fiction texts. Students are working hard on locating key information and using this in their own writing plans. This should contribute to some great discussions at home so make sure you ask lots about what they are reading and encourage them to locate some interesting facts.

In maths, we have been working hard on our basic facts as well as using different addition and subtraction strategies. Our big focus is adding and subtracting numbers in parts rather than counting on.

In Room 2 we have been practicing our drawing and sketching. We drew bumble bees last week. We were so impressed with the finished products. This week we are exploring different materials. We used white chalk and dye to create some cool fossil like pictures.

We have also been consolidating our numbers to 100. We are particularly looking at place value, comparing numbers and number patterns. In Room 2 we have maths buddies, this is someone you work with each day to complete a hands on activity. We are working on our communication, listening and patience. These are very important skills to learn and understand. It is extremely rewarding watching Room 2 develop these skills.



We are making a slow start on our inquiry. Your child should have bought home a letter asking for help in researching their chosen topic. I also sent an email at the end of last week with parent details. After cross country we will be turning our focus to this inquiry, working around Production practices.

The children have been working really well on their training for cross country and we are looking forward to seeing how they go on Wednesday. We look forward to seeing you if you can make it.

In class we are noticing that lots of laptops are not charged when they come to school. Can you please check that your child's charger is named and in their laptop bag and that they know how to charge their laptop.

If you know of any good free maths and literacy games for pc's, I would love to hear what they are. We are always looking for new games to play when we have completed all our learning activities.

Last week and this week the children have been learning some basic Spanish phrases, thanks to Miss Cowling. Maybe you've heard them at home!

Por favor – please; gracias – thank you; De nada – you're welcome; tranquilo – quiet! Hola – hello!; Buenos dias – good morning; adios – goodbye.

If you want to challenge your child, see if they can remember the months of the year in Spanish!





Cross country was difficult but fun! I was very proud of Room 4's effort. Everyone finished the race and we had some 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners too. Fantastic effort! I hope everyone got to try some of the delicious treats and sausages that were available too.

Before the race we did an art activity where we drew a picture of a crazy alien based solely on some verbal instructions. Check out a picture of the four most accurate drawings.

I've heard some positive feedback about Room 4 students doing well in production practice. We're all very excited for the upcoming event!

We've started a little library on a shelf I recently acquired. If you have any books that are age appropriate and are looking for a new home then we'd be happy for some book donations. Thank you for the kids who brought some books for our class before I had even asked!



In Room 5 this week students have had their heads down stuck into their narrative writing. The level of content this year is outstanding. Inspired by the chapter books read by Mr Jepsen after lunchtimes the students have thought extremely hard about the problems their characters will experience. The goal is to make these stories relatable, rather than having fairies living in jungles saving the world from asteroids, we have students writing about characters who are battling with some of life's hardest and realest challenges. Twins of the opposite sex experiencing puberty and feeling different from one another for the first time. Heartbreaking stories from the perspective of a therapist talking to a young girl about her mother running away. We have characters trying to find the strength and courage to stand up to their parents and some just finding enough strength to stand up against themselves. They are real and they are heartfelt.

Mr Jespen would like to say a special thank you to all the parents who have touched base over the last 2 weeks regarding their students' learning progress. It is an absolute rush to celebrate your child's maturity, knowledge and social skills development over the last 6 months.

We are continuing to focus on addition and subtraction. Mrs H reintroduced the symbols plus, minus and equals. The students loved creating number stories with the tee-shirts.

Some of Room 6 students have been practicing their items for the production and they return to class super excited!
