Important Reminders

Drop Off and Pick Up Reminders:

Morning Drop Off:

So as to keep our students safe please do not drop children at school <u>before 8.30am</u> as we are unable to provide supervision. If you need to drop off before 8.30am we strongly recommend that parents/caregivers make use of the private before and after school facility located next door to the school. A charge applies. This is set by the Before and After School Care providers. Supervision before 8.30am remains the responsibility of the parents/caregivers.

Classrooms will be open at 8.30am and we encourage students to be at school between 8.30- 8.45am to prepare for the day.

<u>Classes start at 9.00am.</u> It is very disruptive to the morning procedure if children turn up late. To avoid unnecessary disruption to our students learning, please have your children at school <u>before</u> <u>9.00am.</u> If you are late parents/ caregivers are required to sign your child in at the office.

Afternoon Pick Up:

So as to keep our students safe and ensure that all students get home safely, the following procedures are in place: If you are picking your child up early parents/ caregivers are required to sign your child out at the office.

Years 1 - 3

- 1. All parents will need to collect their child/ren at their class.
- 2. Students need to be collected from class at 3.00pm and no later than 3.15pm as we are unable to provide supervision after this time.
- **3.** If they are attending After School Care, students will be sent to the meeting place / Red Room at the hall.

<u>Years 4 - 8</u>

- 1. If walking or biking Go straight home
- 2.If you are being picked up by a parent or caregiver go directly to the arranged pick up area.
- 3.If they are attending After School Care, students will be sent to the meeting place / Red Room at the hall.
- **4.**If they are meeting a sibling in a junior class, students go straight to their brother or sister's class and wait quietly until the class teacher invites them in and they are then to be collected by parents / caregivers.

If you are unable to collect your child/ren by 3.15pm we strongly recommend that parents/caregivers make use of the private before and after school facility located next door to the school. A charge applies. This is set by the Before and After School Care providers. After 3.15pm students become the parents/caregivers responsibility.

If you are not collecting your child/ren and have made arrangements for a family member or friend to do the pickup please let the school / teacher know. We do not release students into the care of people who are not authorised to collect your children.

Any variations to these procedures **MUST** be requested via email to the classroom teachers.

Please do not be offended if you are reminded of the drop off and pick up procedures.

Swimming:

Swimming is a curriculum requirement. We are lucky to have a pool and staff that are able to teach the basics of swimming and swimming survival. New Zealand has the worst statistics in the OECD for fatal water incidents and already we have too many drownings this year.

We want every child to be able to swim to at least get themselves out of trouble should the find themselves in a situation. To do this we expect every child to swim every day and take advantage of our amazing pool. Swimming is weather dependent.

If your child is unable to swim please send a note /email to the classroom teacher explaining the reason and length of time they are unable to swim.

Let's make a difference and change these dreadful stats.

Rubbish:

We encourage all students to take their morning tea and lunch rubbish home. This is a good opportunity to organise morning tea and lunches into reusable containers. Encourage your children to be part of the process.

Friday Lunches:

All students are able to buy their lunch on a Friday – we have a Tomo's Bakery selection and a Sushi selection. Please bring cash only to the office after 8.30am on Friday morning and place your order.

Stationary:

We hold a small amount of day to day stationary. If your child requires additional stationary you can either pay cash / online bank or hold a credit in a stationary account (preferred option). Ask at the office if you require further information.

We have had Vas visit before and he is not only entertaining, but his magic exhibits a message about positive attitudes towards food behaviour.


Our big inquiry topic in Room One at the moment is 'Who Are We?' We have been looking closely into where our whanau are from and making connections to others in our class. This week we are working on creating our own Mihi and creating some art to go alongside this. These hopefully will be on display in our classroom next week.

We have also been exploring the practice of mindfulness. So far we have practiced taking deep breaths, calming our mind, recognising our feelings and mindful walking. Mindful walking was a great way to connect us back to the present moment and nature all around us.

In maths, we are moving into addition and learning a number of strategies to help us with this. The students are already soaring through their various basic facts warm ups and are excited to see their own progress each day. The students track their results on a bar graph so they can easily see the amazing progress they make.

In Room 2 we have been exploring different colours and art tools to create some abstract portraits. The students did extremely well following multiple instructions.

Writing this week includes character descriptions and adjectives. The students will each describe their own character using adjectives and draw a picture to match. Our reading programme is under way with students reading every night and smashing their reading goals in class.

We have begun our basic facts routine and the children are loving the challenge of getting at least one more right then the day before. We are also

reviewing number bonds and how we can create different numbers. Room 2 are adding numbers together quickly, by counting on from the biggest

number. The children have blown me away with their teamwork during maths. Working together with their maths buddies to complete hands on maths challenges.

Room 2 has already made some amazing progress in the pool. This week our goal was to float on our back. Some students challenged themselves to see how long they could float for. We had multiple children floating for more than 2 minutes! This is a great success!

This week Room 3 students have been working on a simplified pepeha to use a means of making connections with others. We have been practicing hard and once we are confident, we hope to share some of them at assembly.

Reminder that homework books come home on Mondays with spelling words for your child to practice. This book needs to be returned to school on Friday, ready for the following week. Spelling word practice is something that your child can do independently – you don't need to support them in this, other than maybe providing coloured pens or pencils to write their words. Repeated practice, particularly of tricky words, is a great way to reinforce the learning.

Laptops continue to be causing a bit of a problem. Thank you to all the parents who have tried, repeatidly, to set these up. Mr Drury has hopefully fixed that problem and it should be smooth sailing from here.

Swimming will be definitely continuing for the next 2 weeks and then we will review the temperature etc, so please keep sending togs everyday.

In Room 4 the students have finished up their Holiday brochures and their Te Whare Tapa Wha learning.

We are now moving into our Inquiry subject, which is New Zealand's Explosive Past!

We are covering Zealandia moving away from Gondwana, its subsequent effect on creating our unique fauna and flora, and the forces that lead to this movement:

Tectonic plates.

The ring of fire.

How volcanos and earthquakes come about.

We will also cover the amazing teams and people who rally to protect New Zealanders in need during modern day emergencies.

This enquiry will supplement our next art project of unique features of native birds and our upcoming report writing which will be on volcanoes.

In Maths we have been concentrating on place value and multi digit addition and subtraction.

In our reading groups the students have been working on making connections between their world and the stories they are reading and finding the underlying themes of the story.

This week students have been taking control of their spelling and truly pushing themselves towards their goals. Some students have 5 words for the week, some have 15. Some are discovering the definitions of these words and some are confidently using them in sentences. We are all at different levels and we are all working towards our own independent goals.

Reading has dived deep into comprehension. We have groups reading novels whilst making predictions and writing summaries as they go. Another group learnt about Mrs. Winchesters house in California. A 20 million dollar home built with guilt from the money earned from Winchester Rifles. Another group explored the dark journey of Edmond Dantes and how his tale has been twisted over time. Some robust discussions are being had around how time can change things, even truth.

The uniqueness of each student and what gets their blood pumping with enthusiasm is about to be tickled as students begin to dive into our whole class inquiry unit focussing on our roles as individuals and as part of a group within our community. What challenges does our community face? How do we have the power to make a difference? I am very excited to see where this project takes us.




Our maths focus is addition - joining two groups together and counting all. We are still practicing counting forwards and backwards.
